Ages 3-4

Brushstrokes: A program full of art making possibilities designed especially for our youngest artists. Combining play with hands on creative art activities, children will experiment with a variety of mediums including - painting, drawing, sculpture and collage.

Ages 4-6

Art Adventurers: Create a different art adventure each day! Adventurers will use a wide range of playful artist materials while capturing their natural creativity. From painting and drawing to mixed-media and sculpture - Art Adventurers will nourish self-expression, further develop motor skills, and create striking works of art.

Ages 6-12

Character Illustration: Dust off your Sharpies – it's that time of year when everyone's favourite illustrator, Todd Mulligan, inspires us to draw characters, animals, landscapes and everything in between. If you like to draw, sketch or doodle, you'll love Character Illustration.

Watercolour Landscapes: The magic of watercolour paint captures landscapes, light and colour in enchanting ways. Learn how to use different methods – from dry brushing, wet on wet, resists and more to create landscape masterpieces.

Art & Yoga: Namaste at the studio! Discover how to intertwine movement and creativity to open up your best art-self. You'll enjoy a week of painting and poses, drawing and downward dogs and mixed-media and movement.

Paint like the Greats: Kandinsky, Van Gogh, Seurat, Warhol, Picasso and YOU. All the greats in one week will keep your paint brushes happy and your canvas full. It's going to be....you guessed it...GREAT!

Art in the Grove: Explore the intense beauty of the Old Grove situated directly behind Arts Alive. From sticks and stones, mud and water to perfect landscape backdrops for sketching, sculpting and site-specific art making – you'll enjoy this groovy-grovey art making week.

Canadian Art: Canadian art, eh? What's that about? Discover your beautiful country as well as the artists who have been inspired by its grace. From Ted Harrison, Tom Thompson to the Haida and Tlingit peoples, learn a variety of techniques in painting, drawing and mixed-media art.

Art Inventors: You know that thing we use to paint? A paintbrush! That's it. Guess what – someone invented it. What about paint? Yep, also invented. Canvas? Invented. Pencils? Invented. Paper? Invented. Now it's your turn to dream big, wonder, discover, tinker, create your own unique art inventions.

Reclaimed Art: Look around you – the potential for art making is everywhere and in everything. We are going to use reclaimed materials to screen-print, sculpt and re-purpose into amazing art. Participants will be required to bring old t-shirts (printed, stained, torn is fine) and old, broken toys. We'll make them into something new!

Ages 10-14

Expressive Art & Yoga: Release your inner artist while taming your inner critic through expressive art making and movement. Explore mindful art making while relishing in a restorative yoga practice. Enjoy the combination of yoga's meditative qualities for self-reflection while expressing your potential through creating art.

Fashion, Textiles & Accessories:

Participants will learn all aspects of fashion, textile and accessory design. Drawing inspiration from past and present fashion & textile artists, create your own design drawings, produce textile prints & jewelry pieces through the use of innovative materials. Review your best work to present during a final class show.

Film Camp: In this hands-on film production program, we will explore different cinematic genres creating our own film sequence inspired by various styles, directors and ideas. Learn how to story-board and shoot collaborative ideas while trying your hand at writing, directing, production design, cinematography, sound, lighting and even acting! Finally, screen your film with friends & family from our exclusive (private) YouTube channel.

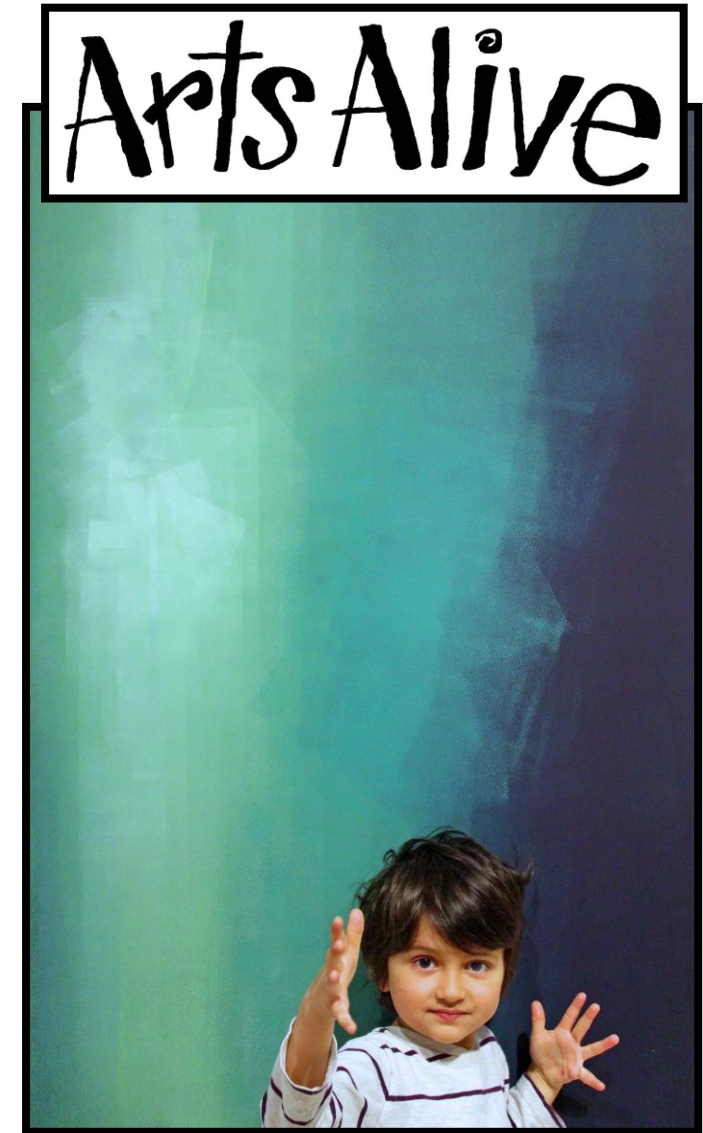
